Black Bean Cakes

Ingredients:

- One 15-ounce can black beans, rinsed and drained
- 1 Cup Frozen Kernels, Defrosted
- 1/2 Cup Shredded Cheddar Cheese
- 1/4 Cup Chopped Cilantro
- 1/4 tsp. Garlic Powder
- 1/4 tsp. Onion Powder
- 2 TBSP. Bread Crumbs
- 1 Large Egg
- Vegetable or Canola Oil, for cooking

Directions:

- 1. Place all the ingredients except the oil in a food processor and puree (it's fine if the puree has a few little chunks).
- 2. Heat the oil in a large sauté pan over medium heat.
- 3. Place 1 TBSP. of the bean mixture in the pan. Using the back of a spoon, spread the mixture into an even circle. Repeat to fill the pan with patties, keeping a bit of room between each.
- 4. Cook for 3 minutes, flip onto the other side, and cook for another 3 to 4 minutes, until cooked through. It is very important to be patient and cook the patties a full 3 minutes before flipping or they may break apart. Set the patties aside when they are done.
- 5. Cook the remaining patties, adding 1 TBSP. of oil for each batch.
- 6. Serve with your desired accompaniments.



We have been extremely interested in bears and learning so much about hibernation, where they live and what they eat. We have been creating characters from our favorite bear books. Have an awesome weekend!!


























Older Preschool

We are closed Monday - enjoy the long weekend! :)








